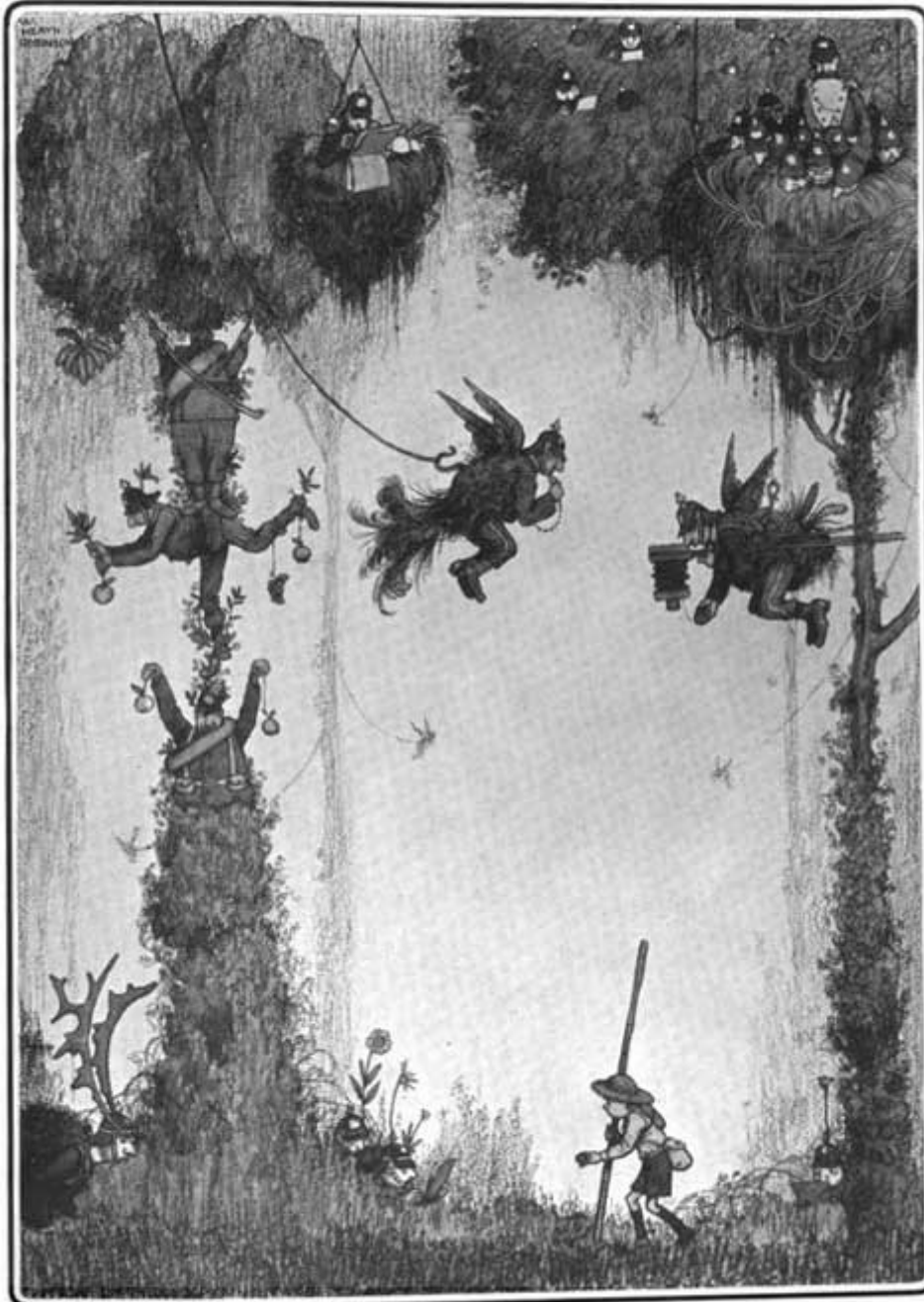

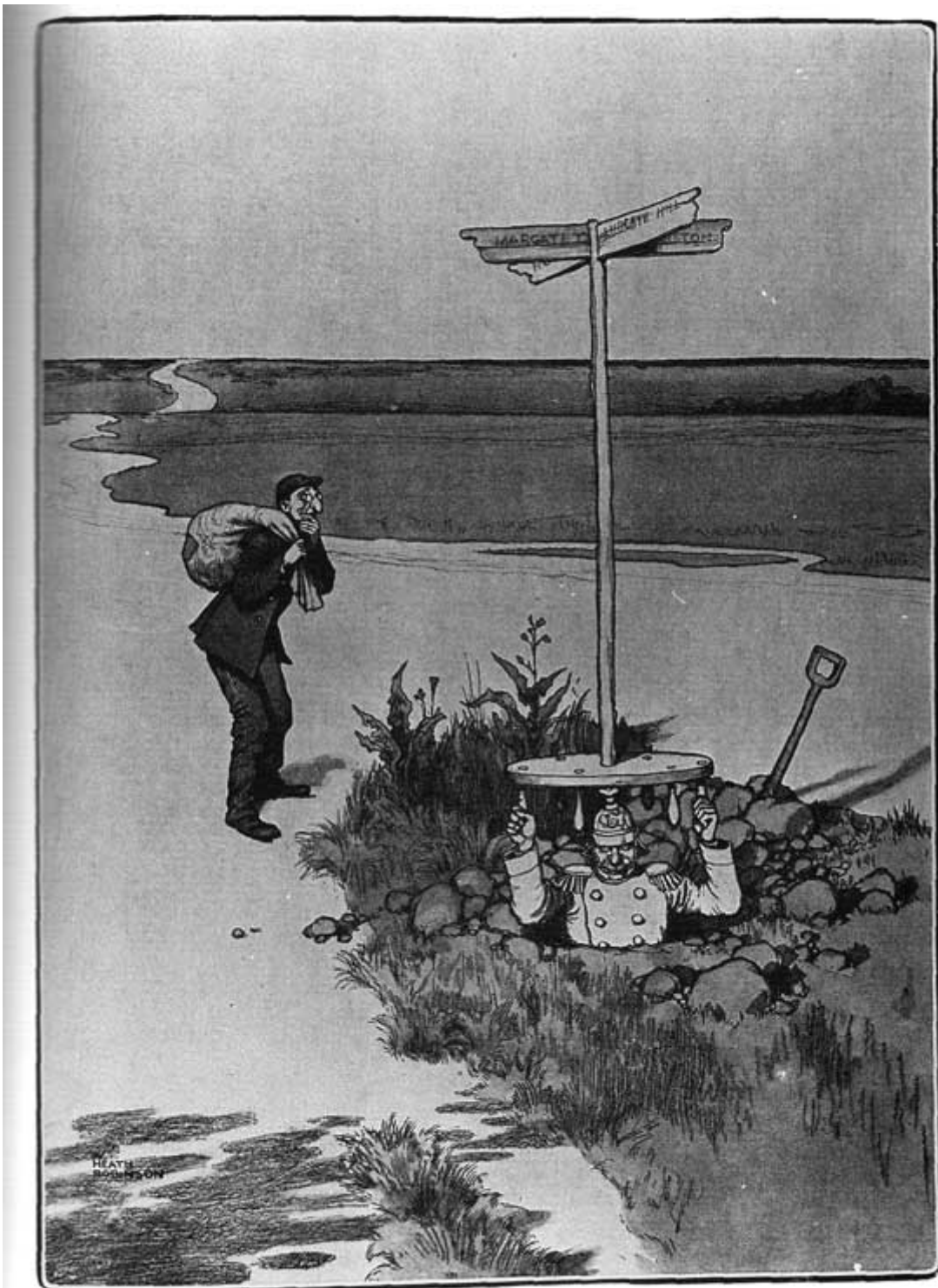

L—GERMAN SPIES IN EPPING FOREST.

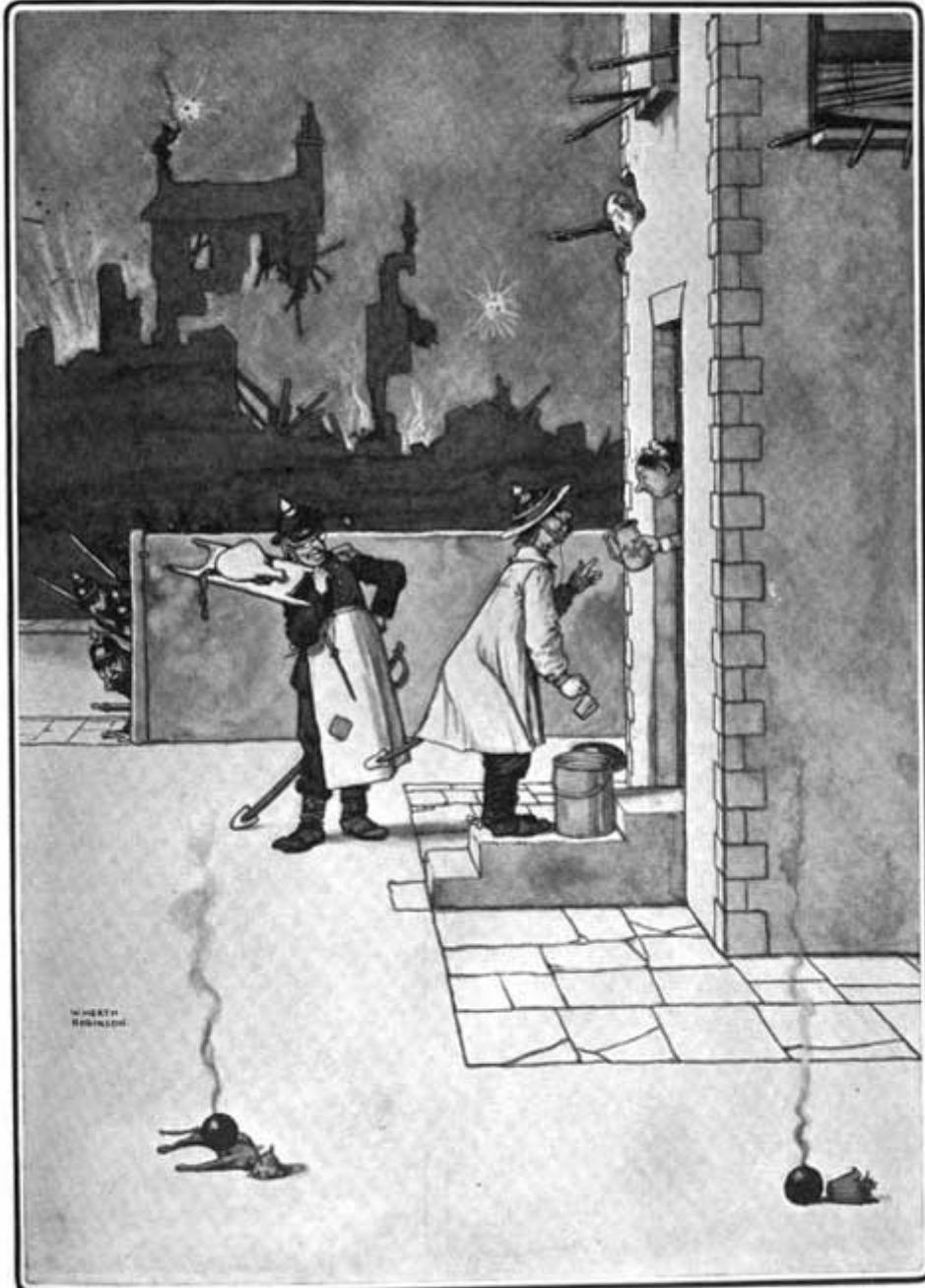

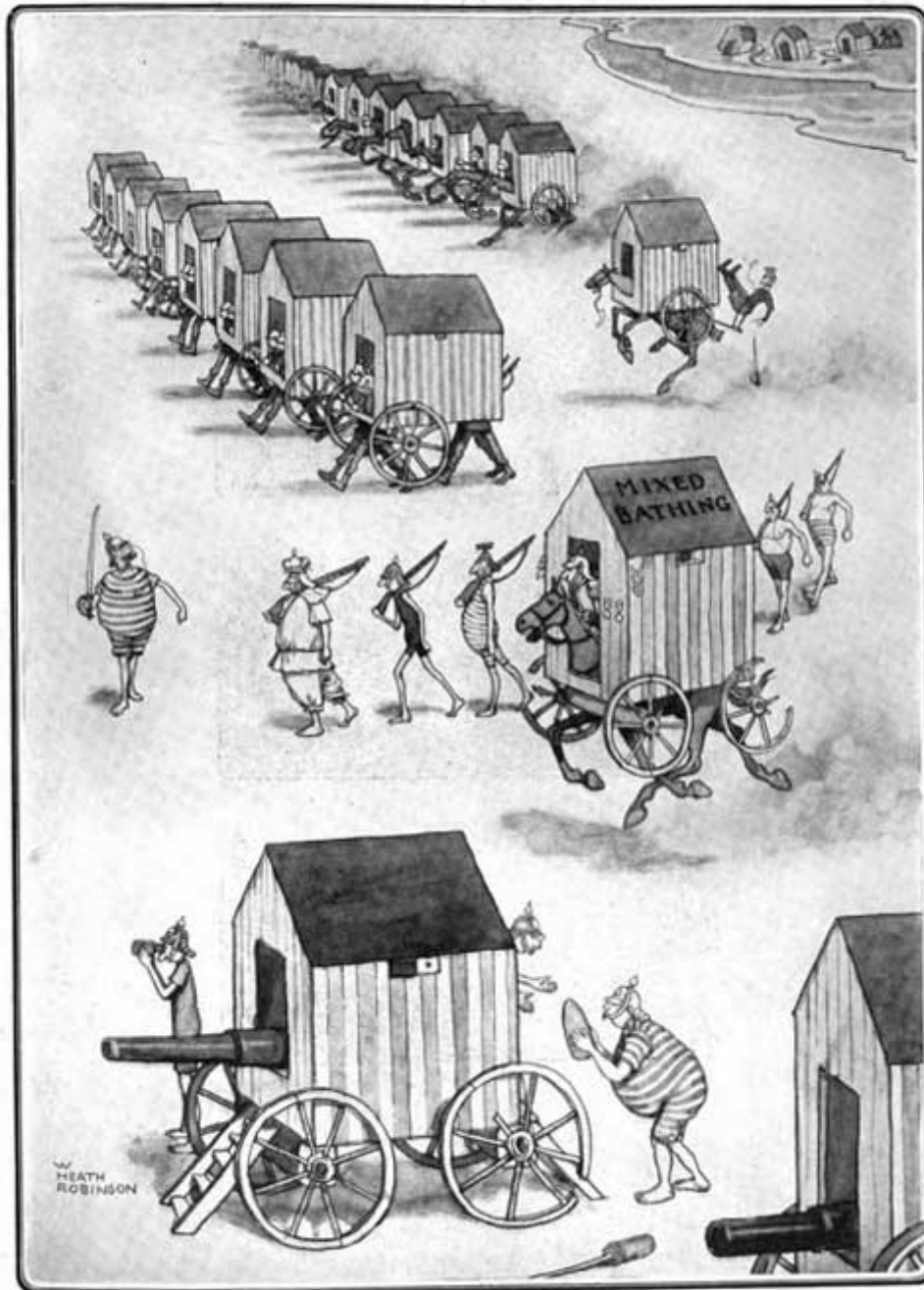

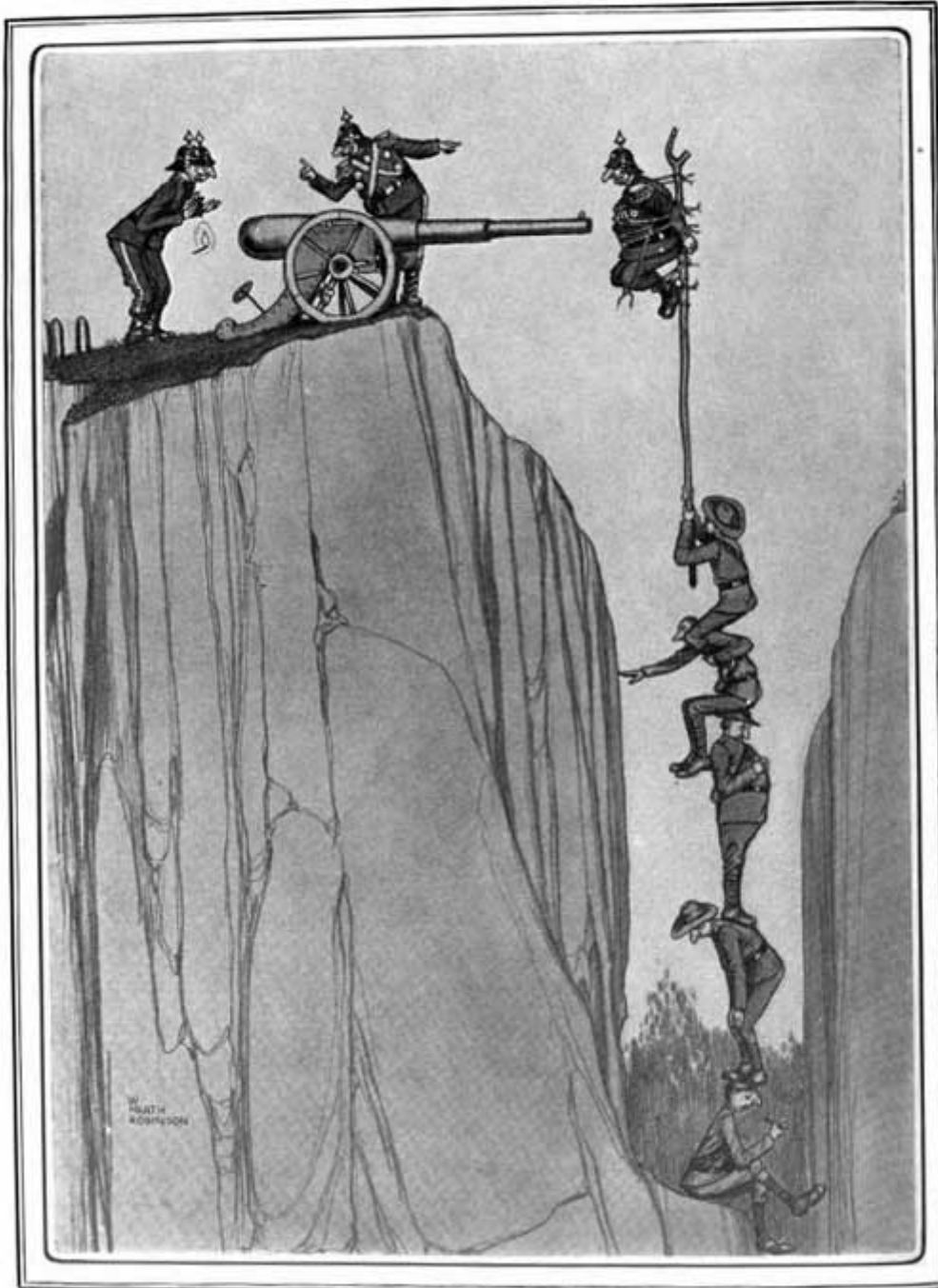

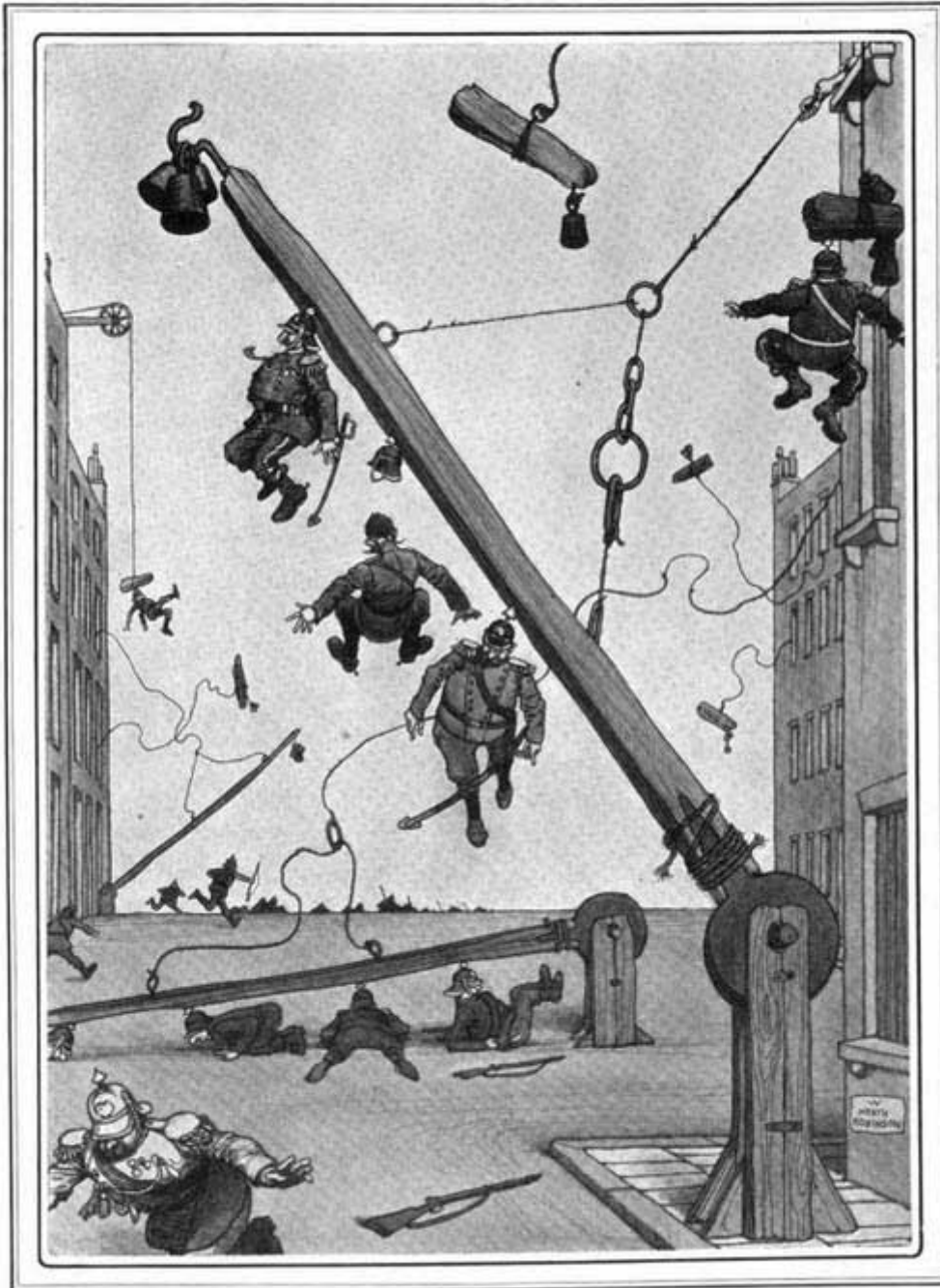

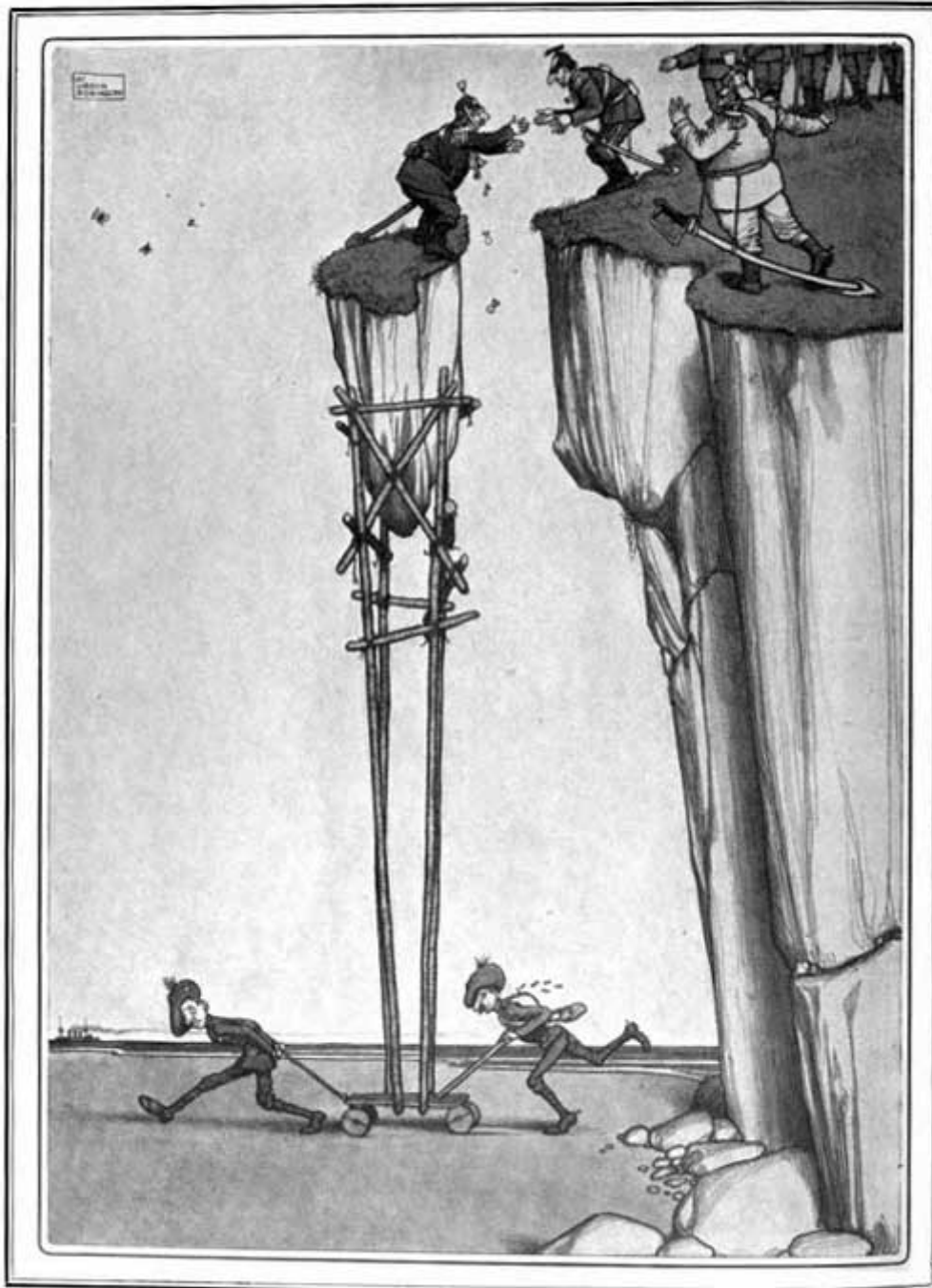
